This exhibition presents a selection of works created through the partnership between Illinois State University's Visiting Artist Program and Normal Editions Workshop (NEW). The Visiting Artist Program brings a number of distinguished national and international artists to campus for long-term residencies and short-term engagements.

Long-term visiting artists teach and lecture about their expertise and pursue their own creative research during their time at ISU. Normal Editions Workshop has worked with a number of these artists to create distinctive collaborative prints.

NEW is a professional printmaking workshop dedicated to publishing original fine art limited edition prints with collaborative teams of students, staff, and visiting artists. Prints on display feature works from twenty years of collaboration between the Visiting Artist Program and NEW. Visiting artists represent a broad spectrum of media, interests, and subject matter, and these diverse perspectives are reflected in the works on display.
